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RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

All programs and memberships are for Scarsdale residents only unless noted otherwise. A resident is a person residing on a property on which the dwelling unit is partly or completely located in the boundaries of the Village of Scarsdale. The Department obtains a residency listing from the Board of Education resident census. If your name does not appear in this listing, proof of residency will be required. **New Residents** – must present their rental agreement or closing contract, along with 2 different utility bills for proof of residency in order to register for programs or memberships.

MEMBERSHIP CARD SYSTEM

Residents who wish to become a member of our pool, tennis and platform tennis facilities must obtain a membership photo I.D. card (permit). Photo I.D. cards are available at the Recreation Office at Supply Building, 244 Heathcote Road—2nd floor.

Important: If you received a new photo I.D. card after 2011 you can renew your membership online. You do not need a new photo I.D. card for 2025.

Lost I.D. Cards – There will be a \$10 replacement card fee for any lost card reprints.

REFUND POLICY

The policy of the Recreation Department is to issue refunds only for serious illness or calamity in the immediate family or when the Department cancels a program. When a refund is given, a processing fee will be deducted to cover administration and registration costs. **Refund request forms must be received prior to start of program to be considered by the Superintendent of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation.**

REGISTRATION

Program and membership registration may be done online at www.scarsdale.gov/catalog or in person at the Recreation Department office at Supply Building. We will not accept registration by phone, mail, or fax. Program registration **WILL NOT** be accepted at the onsite location of the program for any reason.

Please note: Some programs may have limited registration availability which is determined on a first come first serve basis. Registration deadlines may be placed on programs.

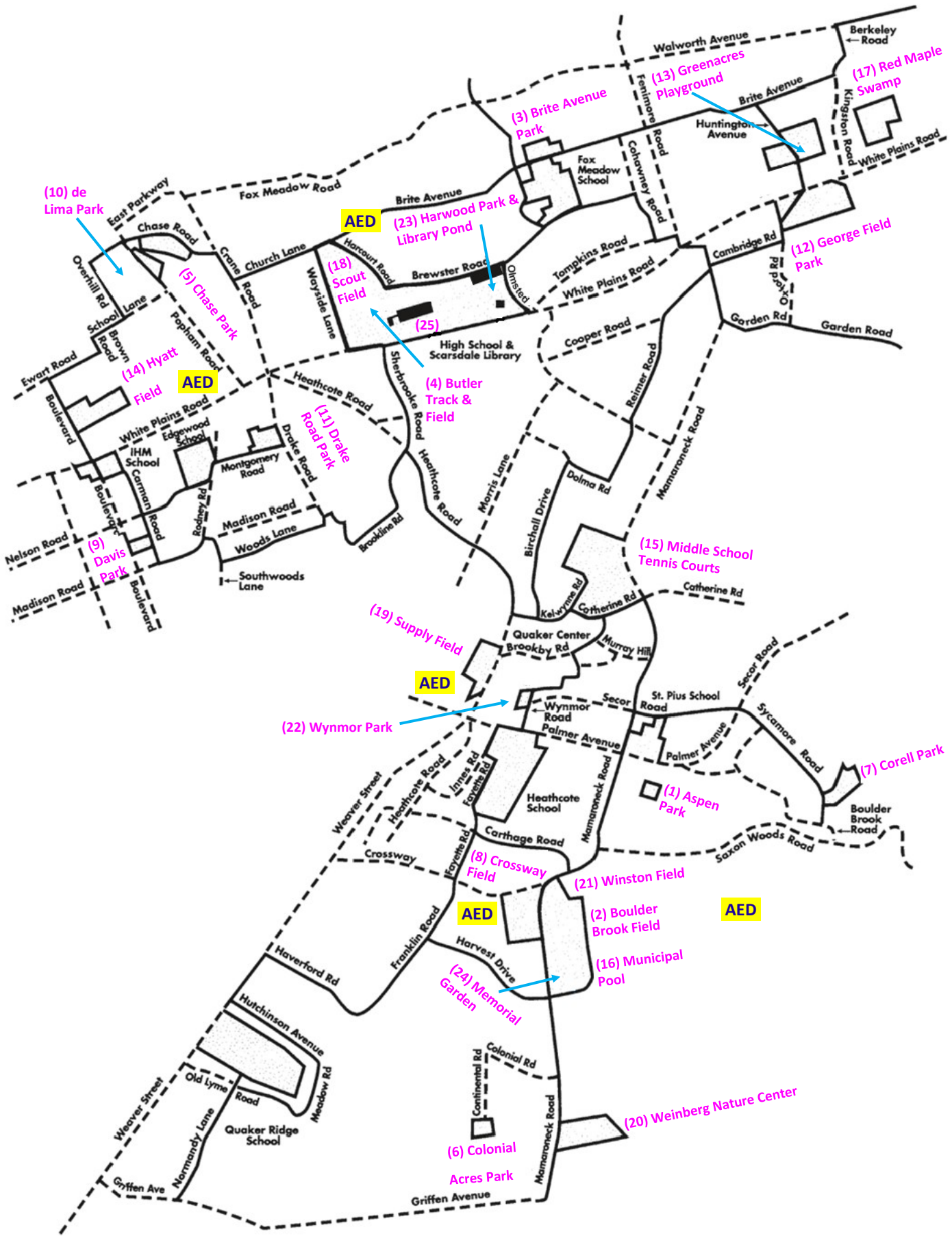

- 8. Crossway Field - 312 Mamaroneck Rd.** Built in 1946 and 1950 on 18.2 acres. Three ballfields, 4 athletic fields, 5 tennis courts, playground, building with bathroom.

- 9. Davis Park - 198 Lyons Rd.** Built in 1927 on 1.4 acres. Neighborhood playgrounds and open field.

- 11. Drake Road Park - 34 Drake Rd.** Built between 1968-1970 on 4 acres. Small field and undeveloped area.
- 12. George Field Park - 1218 Post Rd.** Built in 1928 on 10 acres. Open field and undeveloped area.
- 13. Greenacres Playground - 41 Huntington Ave** Built in 1979. Neighborhood playground.
- 14. Hyatt Field - 143-167 Grand Boulevard.** Built in 1949 and 1952 on 5.1 acres. Large ballfield, small ballfield, basketball courts, playground and exercise equipment. AED available April 1—November 1
- 15. Middle School Tennis Courts -** Built in 1984 on land leased from the Board of Education. Six tennis courts.
- 16. Municipal Pool - 311 Mamaroneck Rd.** Built in 1967 on 7.6 acres. A four pool complex with bathhouses, concession stand, playground, sand volleyball court, and basketball court. Phone #: 722-1292
- 17. Red Maple Swamp - 17 Valley Rd.** Built in 1940 on 5.4 acres. Nature Trail.
- 18. Scout Field - 37 Wayside Lane.** Part of Butler Field. Senior Citizen (Girl Scout House). Large ballfield, croquet course, and Willow playground. AED available April 1—November 1
- 19. Supply Field - 244 Heathcote Rd.** Built in 1961 on 3.4 acres. Two ballfields, storage building, batting cages. AED available April 1—November 1
- 20. Weinberg Nature Center - 455 Mamaroneck Rd.** Built in 1958 on 7.7 acres. Nature Museum and trails. Phone #: 722-1289
- 21. Winston Field - 289 Mamaroneck Rd.** Built in 1984 on 3.1 acres. One large athletic field and two ball fields.
- 22. Wynmor Park - 24 Secor Rd.** Built in 1926 on .89 acres. One tennis court and small field.
- 23. Harwood Park & Library Pond - 56 Olmstead Rd.** Acquired in 1928 on 10.9 acres. Passive park, pond, seating and walking paths.
- 24. Memorial Garden - 311 Mamaroneck Rd.** Built in 1967 on over an acre of land. Memorials to various wars can be found with an open field in the center for reflection & remembrance.

WHEN SCHOOL IS OUT, CAMP IS IN!

Welcome to our 2026 CAMP SEASON!

The camp season is **Monday, July 6th – Friday, August 7th**. The Recreation Department works with the Scarsdale Board of Education to coordinate our camp program. The camp locations are determined by the Board of Education on an annual basis.

We are looking forward to a fun filled and rewarding summer. We are very proud of the outstanding effort the day camp staff makes each summer in striving to attain the goal of giving the children of Scarsdale the very best recreational program possible. Our staff is dedicated to provide an exciting, rewarding and safe summer for your children.

One of the fundamental goals of the camp is to give each of its approximately nine hundred campers the individual, caring attention that will help them have a rewarding summer. To help us better meet each camper's needs, we have a separate camp for each of the following grades:

MORNING CAMP PROGRAMS (GRADES 1ST – 8TH)

DATES: Monday, July 6th – Friday, August 7th TIME: 9:00 am – 11:30 am

SOCCER CAMP

Learn and develop your skills in dribbling, passing, shooting, defending, stealing and more! Participants are separated by age and ability.

DIRECTORS: US Sports Institute (USSI)

LOCATION: Quaker Ridge School

PLEASE NOTE:
Bus transportation is not available for these morning programs

SPORTS CAMP

The Sports Camp places emphasis on baseball, touch football, basketball, field hockey, STX Lacrosse and track & field. Particularly stressed are proper warm-up procedures, physical fitness, skills development teamwork and daily game competition. The camp features a World Series of sports week with individual and team awards. The camp places an emphasis on sports instruction designed to enhance camper abilities as well as their enjoyment of sports.

DIRECTOR: Backyard Sports

LOCATION: Butler Field at Scarsdale High School

CAMP SAGAMORE

FOR: Children entering Kindergarten or 4 ½ years of age on or **before July 7, 2026**

LOCATION: Heathcote Elementary School

CAMP LENAPE

FOR: Children entering 1st grade.

LOCATION: Fox Meadow Elementary School

CAMP WAPETUCK

FOR: Children entering 2nd grade.

LOCATION: Quaker Ridge Elementary School

CAMP PATTHUNKE

FOR: Children entering 3rd through 8th grades

LOCATION: Scarsdale Middle School

COMBINATION PATTHUNKE CAMP

This option is only available to campers who participate in the morning Soccer or Sports Camp. These campers have the opportunity to register for Camp Patthunke in the afternoon. Transportation between the morning camp and Camp Patthunke is provided.

SUMMER CAMPS

AFTER CAMP AT THE POOL

This program will provide fun after camp activities including swimming, sports, games, crafts, and special events between the hours of 3:30 PM and 5:30 PM. Campers will be bused from their camp location to the Scarsdale Pool Complex after the camp day has concluded. Parents must pick up their child from the pool after the conclusion of the after camp program.

Limited space available – 50 campers per week

PREREQUISITE: Must be registered for the following in order to participate in program;

Day Camp, Camp Bus Transportation, and Current Pool Membership.

FOR: Entering Grades K-5th **LOCATION:** Pool Complex

FEE: \$230 per week / \$970 for season (5 Weeks)

DATES: July 6th—August 7th

TEEN TRAVEL CAMP

This camp is for teens entering 6th – 8th grades. Trips are scheduled throughout NY, NJ, CT, LI, & PA. Each day there is a different day trip scheduled. *Please note that due to advanced booking of trips, registration for Teen Travel Camp begins during the winter session each year.

SESSION 1: Monday, July 6-Friday, July 24 - \$2,835

SESSION 2: Monday, July 27 Friday August 7 - \$2,040

ENROLLMENT: First come, first serve basis. Registration begins March 6th

NOTE: Registration is NON-REFUNDABLE

HAPPINESS HAPPENS AT SCARSDALE DAY CAMP



All four camps are under the supervision of a main Day Camp Director. Each camp has a Director on site that coordinates their own challenging and age-appropriate program in sports, swimming, and the arts .

Some special features of the camp include:

WELL QUALIFIED STAFF - The Directors, Specialty Supervisors and other camp administrators are educators with camp experience. Staff members have several years' experience supervising children and will make camp a fun & rewarding experience for all. Counselors are 16 years old or older. Every staff member is interviewed by the Camp Director.

STAFF TRAINING - The entire staff participates in a two day orientation. The camp administration and selected counselors are certified in CPR, First Aid, and EpiPen. In addition, a certified EMT is on staff at each camp.

EXCELLENT SAFETY RECORD - We strive to create a safe environment for all campers. The overall staff to camper ratio is K = 1:6, 1st grade = 1:7, 2nd grade = 1:8, 3rd-8th grades start at 1:8 and goes up to 1:12 for 6th-8th graders.

ARTS & CRAFTS PROGRAM - Arts and Crafts Program – This program is coordinated by an Arts and Crafts counselor. Campers will have arts and crafts throughout the week.

PERFORMING ARTS PROGRAM - This program is coordinated by a Performing Arts Director. Performing Arts specialists work with campers to produce a Variety Show for parents.

INSTRUCTIONAL & FREE SWIM - Safety at the pool is paramount: buddy checks are performed every 15 minutes as per Board of Health guidelines and certified lifeguards teach according to American Red Cross guidelines. Campers will go to the Scarsdale Pool Tuesday—Friday for a 1/2 hour lesson and a 1/2 hour of free swim. On Mondays campers have a shorter schedule due to the hours the pool facility is open.

SPORTS ACTIVITY PROGRAM - A professional sports company with international coaches conducts our camps sports programs and activities. Campers are introduced to different athletic programs and by the end of the season each camper will have experienced a variety of sports from around the world.

CAMP SECURITY - We will be working with the Board of Education security company at each of our camp locations. A security guard will be stationed at the entrance of each camps main entrance. See our Parent Guide for procedures when visiting the camps. The Parent Guide is posted on our Camp Central website.

CAMPS CARES ABOUT HUNGER - Each year all of our day camps participate in the WRAPS CAMPS CARE ABOUT HUNGER campaign. This year the food drive will be held starting the week of July 20th and will culminate at our pool during our SUPER HERO DAY on Saturday, **July 25th**. Let's show that Scarsdale is filled with SUPER HEROES!



SUMMER CAMPS

CAMP HOURS & SCHEDULE

The camp hours are from 9:00 AM to 3:30 PM. Drop off in the morning is between 8:45 am – 9:00 am. Pick up at the end of the day beginning 3:30 pm.

Each group follows a daily schedule which is prepared each summer before camp starts and is designed to ensure that each camper has a balanced program. A typical day at camp includes 5 activity periods and a double period at the pool.

TRANSPORTATION OPTION

Busing is offered to campers at an additional cost which include either a one way option or round trip option per week.

Pick-up and drop-off locations are only available at the following locations: Edgewood Elementary School, Greenacres Elementary School, Fox Meadow Elementary School, Heathcote Elementary School, Quaker Ridge Elementary School, Hyatt Field and the Scarsdale Pool bus stop area.

Morning pickup 8:25 AM

Afternoon drop off: 3:45 – 4:00 PM.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE/DATES:

Register by Wednesday, **April 15th** to receive the early bird rate. Register in-person at the Recreation Office by **June 12th** to be eligible for week 1 of camp (see table below).

The deadline to register online is **Monday, June 8th**. Any registrations received after this date are not guaranteed and will not be able to begin the first week of camp. Refer to dates below for registration timeline after deadline.

**The Recreation Department reserves the right to limit enrollment at any point after the dead- line. If this occurs there will be a wait list and registrants will be notified of status as it becomes available.

INFORMATION REQUIRED TO REGISTER FOR CAMP

Parents are required to have the following information available when registering:

All contact information for each parent, emergency contact person (other than parent) and phone number, and your child's Doctor Contact information.

Child's medical information which includes all up to date immunization history and any medical information (ex. list of allergies, asthma, medicine or physical limitations).

Due to our NEW CivicRec Registration Software all Campers will need to provide all information including all parent & emergency contact, doctor and group information.

PLEASE NOTE: Your registration will not be valid unless you provide us with all the above information at the time of registration. The Westchester County Board of Health requires us to receive all the above information in order for a camper to participate in the camp programs.

PROCEDURE FOR GROUP REQUESTS: At the time of registration you will be given an opportunity to submit a group request. Requests are not guaranteed and are only granted when possible. Requests will only be accepted during the registration process. Groups are formed keeping in mind the camper's area, age, group size and request. Group information is not given out prior to the first day of camp. There are no exceptions to this procedure.

CHANGES TO REGISTRATIONS: If you would like to change your child's registration, i.e. add week(s) or add transportation please see the chart below for registration timelines. Changes will be processed and follow the timeline indicated in the registration dates chart. The timeline ensures the mandated ratios are met and proper staff is provided for a safe camp experience.

POOL COMPLEX

Consists of four pools with bathhouses, playground, concession stand, sand volleyball court and basketball court. **Membership is required to enter the pool complex and to participate in any pool programs.** Pool Complex rules and regulations can be found at the pool complex, the recreation office or online at www.scarsdale.gov/pool.

MEMBERSHIP ID CARDS

All pool members 1 year of age and older are required to have a photo ID card. Photo ID's can be taken at the Recreation Office or Pool Complex. If you have been a pool member at any time since 2011 you do not need a new photo ID card, just renew your membership online.

*Please note: Verification of residency will be done on all returning and new members.

Replacement ID cards are \$10.00.

MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS

Family Membership - FEE: \$760

Includes husband/wife and all children **up to 22 years of age** living with them. *Four guests permitted, per day for a fee.

Family - Weekday Membership - FEE: \$560

Same benefits as Family Membership but requires an additional \$10 fee per person on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays

Individual Membership - FEE: \$455

Designed for single individuals with unlimited pool usage.

*Two guests permitted, per day for a fee.

Individual Weekday Membership - FEE: \$325

Same benefits as Individual Membership but requires an additional \$10 fee on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.

Single Use/Pay As You Go Membership - FEE: \$195

Pay \$10 each visit to the pool complex on any day. Two guests permitted, per day for a fee.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Guests - Fee: \$15 per visit

Guests must be accompanied by pool member to enter pool complex and are required to pay a \$15 entrance fee regardless of age.

Senior Citizens

Residents 65 years of age and older qualify for a 50% discount on all membership permits. .

Special Authorized Memberships

- Memberships designed for:
- * Residents 23 years of age or older residing with the family.
 - * Relatives residing with the family.
 - * Live in caretakers, part time caretakers, and household employees.
 - * Summer house guests.

AQUATICS

LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAM

The Learn to Swim Program is designed to teach individuals how to swim and to be safe in and around the water. Aquatic and safety skills are taught in a logical progression and each level in the program is a building block with vital skills and development. The Learn to Swim Program is the foundation for all aquatic lessons and the Scarsdale Day Camp program.

AQUATIC LEVELS

Aqua-Tots & Tiny Bobbers:

Parent and child aquatics that builds basic water safety skills for guardian and young children to become comfortable in the water.

Pre School Paddlers:

The child has little or no swim lesson experience. Emphasizes water safety and survival concepts.

Learn to Swim:

STARFISH Level 1: Introduction to Water Skills:

Non-swimmer, does not submerge head or body. Designed to help children become comfortable in the water.

GOLDFISH Level 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills:

Successful completion of Level 1 or ability to fully submerge, float on front and back with support for 3 seconds, combine arm and leg actions on front and back.

PENGUIN Level 3: Stroke Development:

Successful completion of Level 2 or ability to swim 5 body lengths using a combination of arm and leg actions (front crawl, elementary backstroke).

SHARK Level 4: Stroke Improvement:

Successful completion of Level 3 or ability to swim 15 yards front crawl, 15 yards elementary backstroke, breast stroke and butterfly.

DOLPHIN Level 5: Stroke Refinement:

Successful completion of Level 4 or ability to swim 25 yards front crawl with rhythmic breathing and elementary backstroke, 15 yards back crawl, breast-stroke, butterfly, sidestroke, and tread water for 5 minutes.

PRE SCHOOL PADDLERS

Provides a positive, developmentally appropriate aquatic learning experience that emphasizes water safety and survival concepts. Swimming skills are age appropriate and prepare children for the Learn to Swim Lessons.

Please note: This class is a prerequisite for 3 year olds who would like private swim lessons. Evaluation is required to participate in this program.

AQUA-TOTS & TINY BOBBERS

Make the first swimming experience with your child safe and fun. Builds basic water safety skills for both parents and children. Children become comfortable in the water so they are willing and ready to learn to swim. Note: Classes will not make children water safe.

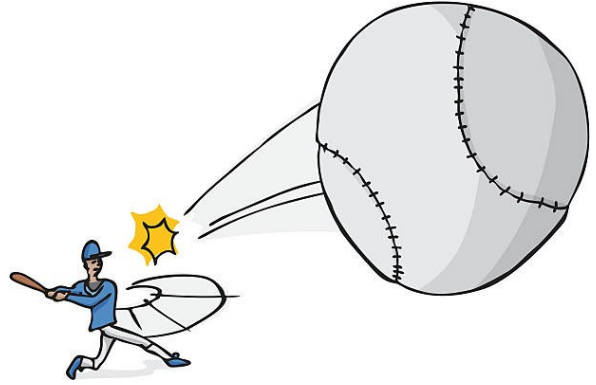

The Scarsdale Parks, Recreation, and Conservation Department works tirelessly to ensure that Village and School District fields are in good condition and safe to be used. In the event of a field closure, the SPRC aims to re-open Village and School District fields as soon as possible.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Each Village field has different drainage characteristics, and the SPRC and the School District Parks Foremen and Grounds staff are very knowledgeable of and attuned to the drainage capacities of every field.

FIELD ASSESSMENT

The SPRC and the School District Parks Foremen and Grounds staff work together closely to assess the condition of all SPRC-controlled and School District-controlled fields. The daily field assessment process, which includes walking and surveying the fields, begins no later than 7:00 AM.

FIELD STATUS REVIEW

After all the fields are assessed, the SPRC and the School District Parks Foremen and SPRC field coordinators review the assessments and determine which fields should be open or closed. This review takes place between 12:30 to 2:00 PM on weekdays and 7:30 to 8:00 AM on weekends.

FIELD CLOSURE NOTIFICATION

In the event of a field closure, the SPRC Field Coordinators will:

Notify affected organizations and users by email, and post an alert, "Important Alerts and Field Closures" with closure information on the SPRC website no later than 2:15 PM on weekdays and 8:15 AM on weekends.



The Superintendent of Parks, Recreation and Conservation (PRC) shall assign access to the available Village and School athletic fields, gymnasiums and other recreational facilities in consideration of the following factors:

- * Priority will be given to primary season sports
- * Enrollment in each program
- * Necessary field usage for each particular athletic program (i.e., the number of times per week a program requires fields, gymnasiums and other recreational facilities for practices and games), bearing in mind gender equality.

It is the PRC's intent and desire to provide access to fields, gymnasiums and other recreational facilities, to the extent practicable, by sport and not by organization.

Appropriate facility usage applications must be submitted to the Village and/or Board of Education for final approvals.

- 1) School District Interscholastic Sports (priority to PRC on Village Fields if needed)
- 2) Village Recreation Programs
- 3) In –Season ISO
- 4) Off-Season ISO
- 5) Resident Bookings

In Season Sports Priority:

Fall Recreation: Youth Football, Youth Soccer, Field Hockey, Cheerleading

Winter Recreation: Youth Basketball

Spring Recreation: Tennis, Youth Lacrosse, Youth Softball

Fall ISO: Scarsdale Youth Soccer Club, Scarsdale Baseball Club

Winter ISO: Scarsdale Youth Travel Basketball

Spring ISO: Scarsdale Youth Lacrosse Association, Scarsdale Little League, Scarsdale Youth Softball Association
