New: Scarsdale Cable TV is Streaming Online in HD!

The Village of Scarsdale is proud to announce that regular Village Board meetings are now being streamed live online in high definition (HD), with HD recordings also available on-demand by visiting the [Cable Streaming](#) page at scarsdale.com and choosing the "Village Board of Trustees" tab. Take a moment to check out the difference between a recent meeting recording and those from last year! Meetings also continue to be broadcast live in standard definition on Altice (formerly Cablevision) channel #75 and Verizon channel #43.

The Scarsdale Cable Commission, a dedicated group of citizen volunteers with expertise in broadcast and cable television, were instrumental in helping to make the move from standard definition (SD) to HD. The upgrade to HD follows the Commission's recommendation to modernize the Village's broadcast equipment, including replacing video cameras in Rutherford Hall and installing state-of-the-art production equipment. Through Scarsdale Public TV ([SPTV](#)), the Commission also supports and promotes public access programming available on Altice (formerly Cablevision) channel #76 and Verizon channel #42.

"Residents now will be able to access better quality recordings and enjoy enhanced on-screen graphics, thanks to this new equipment," said Lorayne Fiorillo, Commission Chair. "Scarsdale Public TV is an important means of communication between the Village and Scarsdale residents. This effort represents the latest step in the Village's efforts to improve and enhance that process."

Funding for the new equipment was provided by Altice (formerly Cablevision) and Verizon through the Village's cable franchise agreements with the carriers. The upgrades mark the latest improvements in the Village's broadcast equipment. Last year, similar HD equipment was installed at the Scarsdale Public Library, allowing [SPTV](#) to record and broadcast some of the library's most important programming for the benefit of residents who are unable to attend in person.
