Storm Update: 10:45 AM

As of this morning, ConEd is tracking 615 customer outages in Scarsdale. This number is down sharply from the 1,660 they reported yesterday. ConEd restoration crews are in the Village today to continue their storm response and restoration activities. ConEd is still reporting that their target for restoring power to 90% of Westchester County customers is 11:00 PM tonight. Intermittent new outages may continue to occur, as necessary to support ConEd's continuing restoration work.

Importantly, where a downed or damaged tree is in contact with a wire, the Village is not authorized to undertake any trimming or removal work unless supporting a ConEd crew already on-site; ConEd is the only entity authorized to correct such conditions.

All local roads are open for traffic, as the closures reported yesterday have been cleared.

Please take time today to check on friends, family, and neighbors to determine if any form of assistance may be needed, or simply to provide an opportunity to talk with someone about their circumstance. The Scarsdale Public Library is open for warming, cellular phone charging, and free coffee from 9:00 AM to 9:00 PM today and Saturday, and from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM on Sunday. In addition, the Scarsdale Volunteer Ambulance Corps has made their headquarters building at 5 Weaver Street available to residents, only, between 7:00 AM and 10:00 PM this week; residents can warm-up, charge phones, and shower at this location, if they wish. Pets are not permitted at either facility.

Residents should report any new power outages to ConEd either online at www.ConEd.com or by calling 1-800-752-6633. Outages already reported can be tracked using the ConEd Outage Map, also available online at www.ConEd.com.

Finally, continue to exercise extreme caution around any downed trees or electric wires. Residents should assume that an electrical hazard is present. Please make sure friends and neighbors are signed-up for Notify Me and have updated their contact information in the Village's emergency robo-call system, Blackboard Connect.
